General Terms and Conditions

Introduction

These Terms & Conditions govern your use of the Night Time Industries Association (NTIA) website, membership services, events, campaigns, and associated content (collectively, “NTIA Services”). By using our website or engaging with NTIA in any capacity, you agree to these terms.

The NTIA is a not-for-profit organisation supporting businesses, operators, professionals, and advocates across the night-time economy. Our mission is to champion a thriving, safe, and sustainable sector through policy, partnerships, training, and accreditation.

Our Structure

“NTIA” and “NTIA CIC”

The Night Time Industries Association operates through two distinct but closely aligned legal entities:

- **Night Time Industries Association Ltd** (Company No. 09418544), a not for profit company limited by guarantee. This entity is responsible for the NTIA’s core activities, including industry representation, events, and partnerships that directly support these functions. Any surplus income is reinvested into advancing the sector.
- **Night Time Industries Alliance CIC** (Company No. 13070504), a registered Community Interest Company (CIC). This arm delivers public benefit programmes aligned with the NTIA’s wider social purpose. It leads on membership services, training and safeguarding initiatives, research, the Night Safe Spaces Accreditation scheme, and associated partnerships.

Although both entities operate under the shared NTIA identity and collaborate to support the night time economy, they remain legally and financially independent.

Depending on your engagement with us, whether as a member, donor, participant, or partner, you may be contracting with either NTIA Ltd or NTIA CIC.

We will always make clear which entity is involved in any agreement, particularly in relation to invoicing, VAT, charitable subscriptions, or publicly funded programmes.

Use of the NTIA Website

Memberships and Subscriptions

NTIA membership is available to individuals and organisations engaged in or supporting the UK's night-time economy. Membership subscriptions may be annual or monthly and are governed by the terms outlined in your agreement or registration confirmation.

All NTIA memberships:

- Are non-transferable.
- Automatically renew unless cancelled in writing with 30 days' notice.
- Contribute to our not-for-profit mission and are non-refundable, except in exceptional circumstances.

NTIA reserves the right to refuse or revoke membership where conduct conflicts with our values or causes reputational harm.

Events and Training

Participation in NTIA events, summits, or training workshops may be subject to separate booking terms. Where applicable:

- Bookings are confirmed once payment is received.
- Cancellation policies will be stated clearly on booking forms.
- NTIA may change event details, speakers, or venues where necessary but will notify attendees in advance.

By attending an NTIA event, you agree to adhere to our event code of conduct and safeguarding commitments.

Intellectual Property

All content on the NTIA website, including text, images, logos, reports, publications, and training materials, is owned by NTIA or used under licence. You may use our materials for personal, educational, or organisational purposes provided NTIA is credited appropriately and no commercial exploitation occurs.

For partnerships involving co-branding or resource sharing, separate agreements will apply.
